

General Fund Expenditures FY25



FY25 BUDGET HIGHLIGHTS

- General Fund Reserves 29%
- Tax Levy Increased from 7.96 to 7.98
- 5% Rate increase in sewer fees
- \$871K Invested in Capital Infrastructure Projects including Street Improvements & Equipment
- Townsend Farms Recreational Trail from 1st
 Street to 5th Street construction complete in Fall
 2024
- Increased funding for training & onboarding of Elected Officials and Board Members


COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

 - Subdivision has been accepted by the City
- Grunwald 2nd Addition
 - West side of Red Bud Circle almost built out 24 three-unit, single story townhouses planned
- Townsend 13th & 14th
 - Construction in progress

LMT has applied for a 7500 sq ft warehouse addition


American Concrete is batching and designs for a large building for enclosed winter batching have been submitted



Analyze traffic data to determine current performance, develop conceptual improvement projects, and assist with planning & budgeting phases


S 1st Street Safety & Connectivity


