The City of Eldridge, Iowa met in an open session at Eldridge City Hall at 7:02 p.m., March 20, 2023.

Council Members Present: Adrian Blackwell, Bruce Cheek, Brian Dockery & Dan Collins. Bernie Peeters arrived at 7:03 p.m. after the approval of the agenda and approval of meeting minutes from March 6, 2023.

Motion by Dockery to approve the agenda. Second by Cheek. Motion approved unanimously by voice vote.

Officer Garret Jahns gave a presentation to the council, thanking them for all the support they give to the Police Department, and what their future goals are when it comes to community events. Officer Jahns asked the council to approve National Night Out for this year and every 1St Tuesday of August along with a golf outing every year to raise money for the K-9. Dockery expressed his thoughts on being on board with approving NNO for every year going forward but would like the golf outing to take place this year and reevaluate after the first one is complete. Blackwell questioned why we are not having the golf outing locally, Chief Sisler stated that they wanted an 22-hole course because the interest in the outing is a larger number, and they want to be able to have 36 teams.

This is a quote we have heard from the time we were little even into adulthood. If you were an athlete, you heard it from your coaches, support staff, and parents. Just go out there and do your best, kid, but your best wasn't good enough. It would be unfair, but nobody would blame the player. They would blame the circumstances.

No game plan for how education supports your future job or career. And certainly, no coaching about how to start or run a business. We're told just go out there and do your best, kid. But our best isn't good enough. We're unprepared for the game. This time, though, people blame the player. Not the circumstances. A more fitting saying would be, "it's a dog-eat-dog world" ...until now.

JA volunteers change the game for our students. They are the player that ignites those around them to do better and be better. They are the ones that young people need. Young people need someone to share their personal and professional experiences and skills to help them make the connection between what they learn in school and life outside the classroom. Someone they can relate to and yet aspire to be.
