City of Eldridge City Council Meeting Minutes

The City of Eldridge, Iowa, City Council met in open session at Eldridge City Hall at 7:02 pm on February 16, 2026.

Council Members Present: Jeff Ashcraft, Adrian Blackwell, Brian Dockery, Ryan Iossi & Scott La Plante. Quorum was met. Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Presiding: Mayor Scott Campbell

Also Present: Nevada Lemke, Jeff Martens, Tracy Northcutt, Andrew Lellig, Tony Rupe, Erin Getz, Dale Grunwald, Marty O'Boyle and Bridget Kramer.

Motion by Ashcraft approving the agenda. Seconded by Dockery. Motion carried unanimously by voice vote.

Public Comment:

Mayor Campbell opened public comment by asking for name, city of residence, respectful comments and gave a reminder of the three-minute limit for presenting. No public comment was made.

Mayor's Agenda

Motioned by Blackwell approving City Council Minutes from February 2, 2026. Seconded by Iossi. Motion carried unanimously by voice vote.

Motioned by Blackwell approving Committee of the Whole Minutes from February 2, 2026. Seconded by Iossi. Motion carried unanimously by voice vote.

Motioned by Ashcraft approving the bills payable in the amount of \$375,762.70. Seconded by La Plante. Motion carried unanimously by voice vote.

Motioned by Ashcraft approving the Liquor License Renewal for Dollar General. Seconded by Iossi. Motion carried unanimously by voice vote.

Motioned by La Plante approving the Liquor License Renewal for Rustic Ridge Golf Course. Seconded by Ashcraft. Motion carried unanimously by voice vote.

Motioned by Iossi approving the appointment of Jeff Hedrington to the Utility Board for a full term to expire February 28, 2032. Seconded by Ashcraft. Motion carried unanimously by voice vote.

Old Business

Motioned by Dockery approving the third reading in title only of Ordinance 2026-01 Rezoning Replat of Muhs Tracts LC parcel numbers 93140530211 and 9314213031 from split zoning R-1 Single Family Residential/R-3 Multiple Family Residential/C-3 General Commercial to R-1 Single Family Residential. Seconded by La Plante. Motion carried on the following roll call vote: Aye – Ashcraft, Blackwell, Dockery, Iossi and La Plante. Nay – None.

Motioned by Iossi approving the third reading in title only of Ordinance 2026-02 Rezoning the replat of Baustian Farms parcels 932505003 & 932521001 from split zoning R-1 Single Family Residential/R-3 Multiple Family Residential/SA-Suburban Agricultural to R-1 Single Family Residential. Seconded by Blackwell. Motion carried on the following roll call vote: Aye – Ashcraft, Blackwell, Dockery, Iossi and La Plante. Nay – None.

New Business

Motioned by Blackwell approving the first reading in title only of Ordinance 2026-03 amending Stop Sign Intersections, Community Center Board, Airport Zoning Board of Adjustment and the Parks and Recreation Board of the Eldridge City Code, making changes outlined, repealing all ordinances and resolutions in conflict with this ordinance and providing for an effective date. Seconded by Ashcraft. Motion carried on the following roll call vote: Aye – Ashcraft, Blackwell, Dockery, Iossi and La Plante. Nay – None.

Motioned by Dockery approving the first reading in title only of Ordinance 2026-04 repealing Sections of Title C, Chapter Two of the Eldridge City Code, and adopting new Sections 3.00 and 3.01 establishing new sewer rates, repealing all ordinances and resolutions in conflict with this ordinance and providing for an effective date. Seconded by Iossi. Motion carried on the following roll call vote: Aye – Ashcraft, Blackwell, Dockery, Iossi and La Plante. Nay – None.

Motioned by Blackwell approving the purchase of a new pickup truck for the Sewer Department at a price not to exceed \$43,000.00 from Lindquist Ford to be paid from the Sewer Equipment Replacement Fund. Seconded by La Plante. Motion carried unanimously by voice vote.

Motioned by La Plante approving a 5-Year 28E Agreement with the Iowa Department of Transportation for the Maintenance and Repair of Primary Roads in Municipalities effective July 1, 2026, through June 30, 2031. Seconded by Ashcraft. Motion carried unanimously by voice vote.

Board/Staff Activities

Mayor's Report – None

City Administrator – Nevada Lemke, City Administrator, stated that the Inspections, Administration/Finance and Special Revenues would be presented at the next Committee of the Whole Meeting. Additionally, 8 people attended the Eldridge Community Center & Skatepark site visit on Thursday, February 12, 2026, with potentially three proposals. The appraisal inspection is scheduled for Tuesday, February 17, 2026.

Assistant City Administrator – Jeff Martens gave an overview of the cyber security training he attended. The City of Eldridge has been actively addressing most of the guidelines advised over the past year and will continue to adhere to recommendations.

City Clerk – Tracy Northcutt, City Clerk, stated over thirty applications were received for Deputy City Clerk and that interviews would be scheduled this week. Council Member Dockery asked when Council would receive the names of people being interviewed. Northcutt stated that information is considered a personnel matter and not open to the public but would consult the City Attorney and report back.

Police – Police Chief Andrew Lellig indicated that the In-Service was completed along with the non-lethal weapons training. Additionally, an inventory of the evidence room has been completed.

Council Member Blackwell announced that a burn ban is in effect for Scott County.

Motion by Dockery to adjourn at 7:19 pm. Second by Ashcraft. Motion was approved unanimously by voice vote.

City of Eldridge Special Committee of the Whole Meeting Minutes

The City of Eldridge, Iowa, City Council met in an open Special Committee of the Whole session at 6:00 pm on February 16, 2026.

Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2027, Maximum Levy & Budget

A. Maximum Levy Property Tax

Consensus of 8.13 for the Maximum Property Tax Levy was obtained with Council member Dockery in support of the rate to remain at 8.11. This amount will be published in the North Scott Press as part of the public hearing notice for the public hearing to be held on April 6, 2026, and provided to Scott County for its mailing.

B. Police Department Budget

Andrew Lellig, Police Chief, gave an overview of the Police Department Budget. Increases in the budget are for contractually obligated wage & step increases and clothing allowances in addition to vest replacement. Body camera hardware & software as well as requested vehicle replacement have added to the Police Department increases.

C. Public Works & Parks Budget

Tony Rupe, Public Works Director gave an overview of the Public Works & Parks Department Budgets. The Parks Department expenses and revenues will be differentiated from the Streets Department where they had been added several years prior. The Public Works Department Budget changes primarily include requested vehicle purchases along with sliplining for storm sewers.

Nevada Lemke, City Administrator, gave an overview of the policies that were attached to the agenda. Staff has been continuously updating documented policies to ensure compliance, transparency, safety and efficiency within the City. Lemke requested Council review and submit questions or comments for further discussion. A formal vote will take place at a later date.





Ordinance 2026-03 contains several code amendments of needed updates. A summary of the code changes are as follows:

1. Due to the stoplight being activated at the intersection of LeClaire Road and 4th Avenue the north and southbound stop signs need to be removed from City Code.
2. The stop sign that was added at the intersection of E. Price Street and N. 2nd Avenue installed at the new entrance to Ivy Acres needs to be added to City Code.
3. Since the Community Center Board has been dissolved it needs to be removed from City Code.
4. The Park and Recreation Board City Code is being updated to remove references to a Secretary-Treasurer as that position no longer exists.
5. The date of February 1 is being removed from City Code as the date the Park and Recreation budget is due to City Council. The deadline to turn in the budget to the state is now the end of April. It is proposed that City Code simply states that a proposed yearly operating budget should be submitted to the City Council for approval to be included in the city's budget.
6. The Airport Zoning Board of Adjustment section of City Code will be removed as this board no longer exists.







ORDINANCE 2026-04

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING SECTIONS OF TITLE C, CHAPTER TWO OF THE ELDRIDGE CITY CODE, AND ADOPTING NEW SECTIONS 3.00 AND 3.01 ESTABLISHING NEW SEWER RATES, REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS IN CONFLICT WITH THIS ORDINANCE AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Section One. The portions of Section 3.00, Chapter Two, Title C, are hereby repealed and the following new language for Section 3.00 is hereby adopted.

3.00 Residential rates. Sewer rates for all single residential properties including property owned by any religious organization and used as a church, synagogue, or other place of worship, shall be based upon average water consumption as billed in the months of January February and March according to the schedule below. A single residential property is defined as a single-family home, an individual townhouse or row house, an apartment within a larger building, a mobile home or any grouping of rental rooms using a common bathroom. All residential users shall be charged the same rate regardless of the location where wastewater is treated.



The bill, as determined by the average consumption described above, shall become effective with the April 1st billing of each year, and remain in effect until April 1st of the following year. Prior to April 1st of each year, average consumption shall be recalculated to determine if the residential customer's bill should be adjusted. Properties connected to sewer, but without metered water consumption, shall be subject to the minimum billing amount.

Section Two. The portions of Section 3.01, Chapter Two, Title C, of the Eldridge City Code are repealed and the following portion of Section 3.01 is hereby adopted.

3.01 Commercial and Industrial Rates. Sewer Rates for non-residential users, including schools, shall be based upon monthly water consumption. All nonresidential rates shall be charged the same rate regardless of the location wastewater is treated.



AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE C, CHAPTER ONE OF THE ELDRIDGE CITY CODE ESTABLISHING FEES FOR CONTRACT HAULER WASTEWATER DISPOSAL, REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS IN CONFLICT WITH THIS ORDINANCE AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Section One. Title C, Chapter 1 Sewers, § 4.00 Private Wastewater Disposal is amended by adding the following language:

Private contractors working within the Eldridge city limits may occasionally accumulate wastewater from projects such as washing, vac collecting and other like nonchemical related activities. Such wastewater can be disposed of at the Eldridge Wastewater Treatment Plant under the following conditions:

- (A) Only wastewater originating within the Eldridge city limits will be accepted
- (B) No wastewater containing dirt, mud, gravel, sewage, fats, oils, grease, or other unknown, or potentially hazardous chemicals will be accepted
- (C) City staff may require laboratory testing, at the hauler's expense, to verify the contents of the wastewater prior to discharge
- (D) City staff have the authority to refuse acceptance of any waste
- (E) Approved discharges must be scheduled with City staff present during the discharge

Fees for this service are listed in Title C, Chapter 2 Sewer Rates, § 3.01 Commercial and Industrial Rates, (C).

Section Two. Title C, Chapter 2 Sewer Rates, § 3.01 Commercial and Industrial Rates is amended by adding the following language:

(C) Contract haulers and other service providers working on projects within the Eldridge city limits and wishing to dispose of wastewater at the Eldridge Wastewater Treatment Plant as established in Title C, Chapter 1, § 4.00 shall be subject to the following rates:

Cegan has successfully passed the Grade 4 Treatment and Distribution certification (congratulations to Cegan on this accomplishment) Lastly, the crew continues working on meter swaps and ensuring reliable water service throughout the system.
